A brownfield is defined as: real<br>property, the expansion, redevelopment, or reuse of<br>which may be complicated by the presence or<br>potential presence of a hazardous substance,<br>pollutant, or contaminant. The 2002 Brownfields Law<br>further defines the term to include a site that is:<br>"contaminated by a controlled substance;<br>contaminated by petroleum or a petroleum product<br>excluded from the definition of 'hazardous substance';<br>or mine-scarred land." | Application opens late<br>September-Early October with<br>60 day due date |
