Grant/Loan Program	Program Purpose	Due Date
The Wahlert Foundation	Grants are made for basic human needs, such as: emergency assistance for families, medical care for seminarians from foreign countries, domestic violence prevention, food and housing for the needy, scholarships for low-income students, crisis care for children, food vouchers, and safety upgrades for a homeless shelter.	Applications accepted in June, July and August
The Wellmark Foundation - Small MATCH Grant Program	The Matching Assets To Community Health (MATCH) grant program is a challenge grant designed to bring other funders together to support larger community health projects needing potentially higher levels of funding or collaboration. Supports nonprofit organizations and community groups that develop and implement sustainable projects that focus on active living and healthy nutrition. Challenge grants up to \$25,000 to be matched 50 percent	16-Jun-17
Creative Leadership Grants 2017	The 2017 program provides grants for innovative, creative leadership team building within elementary schools. Apply now for the opportunity to receive a grant for building your school's creative capacity. Each grant-winning school (up to 20 grants awarded) receives \$2,500 and Crayola products valued at \$1,000.	23-Jun-17
State Recreational Trails	Acquisition, construction or improvement of recreational trails. Trails must be open for public use.	1-Jul-17
Baseball Tomorrow Fund	The Baseball Tomorrow Fund (BTF) awards grants to non-profit and tax-exempt organizations involved in the operation of youth baseball and/or softball programs and facilities. Organizations operating in the U.S. and international locations are eligible to apply. Average grant size is \$40,000.	1-Jul-17
Clinton County Community Development Association - Fund B	Funds allocated to Fund B may be awarded, subject to a matching funds requirement, to qualified organizations up to \$75,000.	11-Jul-17
Community Attraction and Tourism (CAT)	The Community Attraction and Tourism (CAT) program was created to assist projects that will provide recreational, cultural, entertainment and educational attractions. Projects must be available to the general public for public use and be primarily vertical infrastructure.	15-Jul-17
Mediacom Arts and Culture Grants	Provides funding annually to Dubuque arts and "non-arts organizations" to support a distinct aspect of the organization's arts activities, such as a one-time event, a single production, an exhibition, an educational seminar, or series of related arts activities, such as art classes or training sessions.	31-Jul-17
Eastern Iowa Regional Housing Corporation	The mission of the EIRHC Housing Trust Fund is to assist in the provision of providing decent, safe and affordable housing,	1-Aug-17

	as well as providing access to the resources for creating housing opportunities to the families served in eastern Iowa. The emphasis is to provide economic assistance to benefit the -moderate, very low, and extremely low-income residents of Dubuque, Delaware, Jackson, Cedar and Clinton Counties for a variety of housing needs.	
REAP—County Conservation	Land easements/acquisition, capital improvements, stabilization/protection of resources, repair/upgrade facilities.	15-Aug-17
REAP—City Parks & Open Spaces	Park land expansion and multipurpose recreational developments. NO matching funds required.	15-Aug-17
Theisen's More for Your Community	Annually makes grants to all 20 Theisen's store communities. The program grants to agencies that most effectively, directly serve the basic needs of families and children, which includes food, shelter, education, safety and health.	15-Aug-17
Dyersville Area Community Foundation	The Dyersville Area Community Foundation makes grants to nonprofits with a 501 C (3) status that are located in the communities of Dyersville, Earlville, Farley, Luxemburg, New Vienna, Petersburg, and Worthington. Applications are available in June and due in August. Grants are awarded in September.	29-Aug-17
Anamosa Community Foundation	Organizations applying for grant funding must be applying for a project which is specifically for Anamosa. The amount of funds available this year is \$5,000.	31-Aug-17
