We have received your submittal for the above referenced federal undertaking. We provide the following response in accordance with Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 and its implementing regulations 36 CFR 800.

Regarding this project, please see the following comments:

R&C 211116951 - EPA - Cedar - Stanwood IA Broadway Properties Asbestos Brownfields RLF Cleanup - Project Includes R&C No:21116952. The attached properties at 211 and 213 Broadway in Stanwood, IA are structurally unsound and are contaminated with asbestos containing materials throughout. The vacant properties are a safety threat to the community and need to be removed. Because the structures are inaccessible, the safe approach for abatement is demolition and removal of contaminated debris. The City of Stanwood proposes to use federal funds from a sub-award and a loan through the East Central Intergovernmental Association from an EPA Brownfields Revolving Loan Fund Cooperative Agreement.
